- b) Wildlife Protection Society was set up in 1994 to implement conservation campaigns around the tiger reserves in central India.
- c) Corbett National Park was established in 1936 to save the endangered species of Royal Bengal tiger.

### 6. What are stray animals?

Ans. Stray animals are neither wild nor domestic. We can commonly see them on roads and streets. Though they live free of humans, they partially depend on humans for food and shelter e.g. cats and dogs.
