Sentence: A sentence is a group of words that make complete sense. It starts with a capital letter and ends with a full stop (.), or a question mark (?), or an exclamation mark (!).

Examples: Ali sings a song.

Is Rupa studying?

How cold the water is!

KINDS OF SENTENCES:-

There are four kinds of sentences – ASSERTIVE/ DECLARATIVE Sentences, IMPERATIVE Sentences, INTERROGATIVE Sentences and EXCLAMATORY Sentences.

ASSERTIVE/ DECLARATIVE Sentence: A sentence that expresses a simple statement of fact is called an Assertive or Declarative Sentence.

For example – This is a book. She is a nice girl. Rohan is my cousin. This bag belongs to him.

IMPERATIVE Sentence: A sentence that expresses a command/ order/ request/ advice or wish is called an Imperative sentence. In Imperative sentences, the subject is usually omitted.

For example – Be careful. Please don't go. Please open the window. Save more money. Respect your teachers.

INTERROGATIVE Sentence: An Interrogative sentence expresses a question.

For example – Is this your book? What is your name? When did you come?

EXCLAMATORY Sentence: A sentence that expresses a strong or sudden feeling is called an Exclamatory sentence. The Exclamatory sentence begins with **What** or **How** or an **Interjection**.

For example – What a beautiful girl she is! Oh! I've lost my purse. Today was the best day ever!
